Scholarships for General Excellence (Indigenous Education) are offered to students entering Year 7-9 in 2024 and Year 7 in 2025.

Scholarships are open to talented students of Australian Indigenous descent who live in the Melbourne Metropolitan area and satisfy the selection criteria. Offers will be made to those who are most prepared to give their best efforts towards completing Year 12 and participating in the exceptional opportunities on offer at Trinity.

The best-suited students will be resilient and courageous young men who are inspired to participate and connect with the Trinity experience and who persevere when challenged.

EXPECTATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

- Maintain sound academic standards
- Make ongoing contributions to the wider life of the School, for example, in Sport, Arts, House Activities, etc.
- Uphold and support the values of Trinity Grammar School

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- Entering Year 7 in 2025
- Live in the Melbourne Metropolitan area with the means to travel to and from school independently
- A standard of academic merit suitable for Year 12 completion
- Highly enthusiastic approach to the exceptional opportunities available within the Trinity community.
- Identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- Parents/Guardians support the application
- Parents/Guardians commit to make a financial contribution to the annual tuition fee obligation of \$4,000 per annum and can meet uniform and other resource costs as listed on the following page.

WHAT IS COVERED BY THE SCHOLARSHIP

Tuition Fees – All regular fees outside of the \$4,000 per annum Parent/Guardian contribution.

Uniforms – Summer and Winter uniforms will be covered. This may include new, or good quality second-hand uniforms if available. Please note that school shoes are not provided, and that replacement of uniforms due to loss or damage other than reasonable wear and tear will be the responsibility of Parents/Guardians.

Resources – All textbooks, laptops and technology needs will be covered. Laptops and accessories remain the property of Trinity. Repair or replacement of laptops and accessories due to loss or damage other than reasonable wear and tear will be the responsibility of Parents/Guardians.

COSTS TO FAMILIES

All Parents/Guardians are required to contribute \$4,000 per annum towards tuition fees.

Other regular or ongoing costs to Parents/Guardians:

- School and sports shoes
- Musical instrument hire and lessons
- Non-compulsory excursions, camps, or sporting commitments
- Medical and dental expenses
- Study nights
- Cafeteria expenses
- Myki/transport costs
