Supplementary Information

Means Tested Scholarships are offered to students who demonstrate outstanding potential to benefit from, contribute to, and influence others through the school's academic, Musical or broader Co-Curricular Programs.

Scholarships attract a reduction in tuition fees only, as determined by the Principal. Scholarships continue while the student remains at Trinity, subject to the school's standard Conditions of Entry and also to periodical Performance Reviews through which the holder demonstrates exemplary standards of effort, progress, involvement, contribution and influence on his peers.

Scholarship Eligibility and Financial Assessment

A Means-Tested Scholarship is offered to students entering Years 9 to 11 from outside the school, on the basis of a student profile and interview.

The Scholarship will be means-tested through the submission of evidence demonstrating financial need. At the time of application, families are required to provide:

- Completed Fee (Bursary) Assistance Application
- The three most recent ATO tax returns for each parent/guardian
- Business financials and a statutory declaration, if the parent/guardian is a business or company owner

The Principal will review the progress of the Scholarship holder annually.

The Scholarship may not be held in conjunction with any other scholarship or bursary. This scholarship is not open to students who are currently attending the school.

Student Selection Criteria

The successful applicant must be able to display a positive attitude to learning and be achieving at a satisfactory academic level; be able and willing to embrace the spirit and culture of the school and demonstrate that he would benefit from the opportunities that a TGS education would provide. It is important to note that the scholarship is not allocated solely on the basis of academic or co-curricular excellence.

The recipient will be a student of fine character who can demonstrate their willingness to embrace the spirit and culture of TGS, and who will benefit from a TGS education, considering:

- Interview
- School reports
- Naplan results
- Demonstration of participation in and contribution to the community

Conditions of the Scholarship

Under normal circumstances, the scholarship holder is expected to remain at the school until they complete Year 12. In the event of the student's withdrawal prior to this time, the full value of the scholarship to the time of their withdrawal will be repayable to the school by the parent accepting the scholarship on behalf of the holder.

The Principal, at his absolute discretion, may waive this obligation or fix a lesser sum as payable by the parent/guardian, particularly if the withdrawal is due to circumstances beyond the control of the parent/guardian (e.g., transfer interstate or overseas).

On completion of the scholarship, it is expected that the recipient will write a report to the Principal outlining their experience at Trinity Grammar School, Kew.

A Means-tested scholarship is subject to a periodic performance review that addresses the criteria applicable to all scholarships at Trinity whilst laying particular emphasis on the standards in the School's Cocurricular Policy.

It is expected that, should the recipient of the scholarship ever be in a financial position to support the TGS Scholarship Fund in the future, they will consider doing so. Additionally, as a graduate of Trinity it is expected that the recipient support the school to promote its scholarship program – for example, by participating as a guest speaker or campaign patron.

Application Process

Please submit a profile of your son's achievements, together with the completed copy of the Application Form via admissions@trinity.vic.edu.au, by the due date.

- Applications must include a copy of the applicant's last two school reports and the latest Naplan report.
- Two references are to be provided, one from the student's current Principal or class teacher and the other from a person relevant to the area of Cocurricular Activities
- The student's profile must demonstrate a balance between his talent in a range of cocurricular areas, his qualities of leadership, his willingness to become involved in all facets of school life and his academic potential.
- Evidence of financial need, including:
 - Completed Fee (Bursary) Assistance Application
 - The three most recent ATO tax returns for each parent/guardian.
 - Business financials and a statutory declaration, if applicable.

Shortlisted applicants and their families will be invited to attend an interview with the Selection Panel.
